In the Kitchen...

After visiting the orchard, make some homemade applesauce!

3 pounds apples (about 8-9 medium apples) ³/₄ cup water 2 teaspoons lemon juice Optional: ¹/₄ cup sugar

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

 Place all ingredients in a medium sauce pan, cover and bring to a simmer over medium heat. Cook for 15-20 minutes or until apples are soft and easy to mash.

Allow to cool at least 10 minutes before serving.
