Winter Boredom Busters

Tape Shape Game: Use painters tape to create a variety of shapes, letters, and/or numbers on the floor. Have your child stand on their favorite one, then give them instructions to follow that will lead them to their next destination. For example: “Bear crawl to the square”, “Hop like a Frog to the T” or “Run to the rectangle”). This game keeps your child moving, but can also help them learn their shapes, letters and numbers!

Puzzle Piece Hunt: Takes pieces of a wooden puzzle and have your child search for them, returning each piece to the board as they go. This game gets them moving, encourages their critical thinking, and they will enjoy working towards a goal. They’ll beg you to hide them again!

Ice Fishing Science Experiment

Supplies

Ice cubes

Glass of water

Salt

Food coloring (optional)

String or twine

Directions: Add half a dozen or so ice cubes to a cup and fill with water. Lay the string over an ice cube. Sprinkle salt over the string and ice. Wait 30-60 seconds. Gently pull the string. The ice should come along with it!



Get Cooking!

Cooking with your children is not only fun, but has developmental benefits as well! When you cook with your children, you improve their social-emotional development by building their confidence and encouraging self-direction and independence, improve their physical development using fine motor and hand-eye coordination skills, and improve their cognitive development by encouraging their thinking, problem-solving, and creativity!

Banana Snowman

What you'll need:

- Bananas
- Mini chocolate chips (or small raisins if you prefer)
- Pretzel sticks
- Baby carrots (sliced into small pieces by adult)
- Strawberries

What to do:

- Prepare the ingredients
- Peel and slice the bananas into several round pieces
- Cut strawberries into halves for the hats
- Arrange three banana slices on a plate, one on top of each other
- Place strawberries on top of the snowman's body with the cut side down.

Recalls

- Cosco Jump, Spin, & Play Activity centers. The straps can detach or break while a child is in the activity center, posing fall and injury hazards.
- Thomas & Friends Wooden Railway Troublesome Trucks & Crates, and Thomas & Friends Wooden Railway Troublesome Truck & Paint. Small plastic piece contains a high-powered magnet that can detach or become loose, posing choking and magnet ingestion hazards.
- Hearth & Hand w/ Magnolia Mushroom Peg Sorters. Stems of toy mushrooms can detach, posing a choking hazard.
- UncleWu Life Infant Bath Seats. Fails to meet federal safety regulation for infant bath seats, including requirements for stability and leg openings, and can tip over while in use, posing a drowning hazard to babies.
